The latest situation report as of May 6 confirms that 284,455 houses have now been destroyed and another 234,102 damaged. The numbers of reported casualties increased to 7,675 deaths with 16,392 injured. This field report will provide an inside look at the disaster and relief effort, as well as offer ways we all can support those who were affected by the quake.

After extensive disaster relief experiences in Tohoku since the 2011 earthquake, Tokuchi Yoshiko was stationed in Nepal on 25 April 2015 when the earthquake hit. Using insights gained from her experience in Tohoku disaster, she will outline the current situation in Nepal s and Habitat's response plan. As an international housing NGO, Habitat for Humanity Japan presents why decent housing is needed to protect human lives from the natural disasters and also how the experiences of Tohoku are taken advantages of for the coming disasters.

She has worked in Nepal since April 2015 for the assessment and planning of Habitat for Humanity Japan's coming project. Born in the US and raised in China and Singapore, she holds an LLB from the University of Tokyo.
